From the President's Desk

Goals for 2023

Another new year—happy 2023! I hope you accomplished all your goals in 2022. Remember those goals you set last January? My article a year ago was all about setting goals. I suggested everyone make goals, write them down, make a plan, and track their progress. I also suggested both short-term and long-term goals. Don't have vague goals like, I want to write more. Exactly how are you going to accomplish that? A goal is nothing more than a wish until there is a plan in place and a way to measure progress.

I fell a bit short of my writing goals for last year. I did not write as many stories as I wanted, and I did not complete my longer work-in-progress and send it to a magazine for publication. However, I did complete a first draft of my first novel length work. It is always better to have ambitious goals and fall short than to have small, easy goals and complete them all.

My personal goals for 2023 include writing 8 short stories for Saturday Writers contests, completing and submitting my longer story to a science fiction magazine for publication, and complete a second draft of my first novel and have it reviewed by beta

readers.

I also have some goals for Saturday Writers in 2023. Last year was a very successful year and I hope to build on that success and make 2023 even better. Here are my plans:

- Hold 9 regular meetings on the last Saturday of each month, January to September.
- 2. Have 4 workshops in the month of October
- Release our anthology with a book signing event in the spring
- 4. Be part of the St. Louis Writers Guild Conference on Saturday March 4.
- 5. Have 9 open mic events
- 6. Participate in 2 Pen & Paint receptions on 1 June and 2 November.
- 7. Have a Holiday Party on Saturday 2 December
- 8. Have at least 2 additional social events for the SW membership
- Coordinate with the St. Louis Writers Guild and possibly team up for a combined activity.
- 10. Attend as many book fairs as we reasonably can to sell more books and promote the name of Saturday Writers

We have already had our first officers meeting of 2023 where we discussed these goals and
